FROM THE RABBI

Mindset

As this bulletin arrives in your home, the city will be preparing for the NYC Marathon. In the days leading up to the race, it is always exciting to walk through the park and see athletes from all over the world on their final training runs. Truly inspiring!

On Erev Rosh Hashanah, I shared with the community thoughts about a book I read this past summer, titled *The Perfect Mile: Three Athletes, One Goal, and Less Than Four Minutes to Achieve It*. It's the story of a time when running the mile in four minutes was believed to be impossible, beyond the limits of athletic achievement. Since at least 1886, runners had been pursuing this goal, and as British journalist and runner John Bryant says, "For years milers had been striving against the clock, but the elusive four minutes had always beaten them. It had become as much a psychological barrier as a physical one. And like an unconquerable mountain, the closer it was approached, the more daunting it seemed." The experts predicted the exact conditions that would be most conducive for someone to run a four-minute mile: perfect weather, 68 degrees, no wind, on a hard, dry, clay track. And then, on a cold day, May 6, 1954, on a wet track, Roger Bannister ran a mile in 3 minutes, 59 and 4/10ths of a second.

One of the most interesting aspects this story is that after Bannister's incredible achievement of what up until then had been considered to be impossible, just 46 days later another runner clocked in at 3:58. And just a year later, three runners broke the four-minute barrier in a single race.

There were no major technological breakthroughs in running technology or training techniques to explain this phenomenon. So what changed? Said Bannister as the 50th anniversary of his achievement approached: "It became a symbol of attempting a challenge in the physical world of something hitherto thought impossible. I'd like to see it as a metaphor not only for sport, but for life and seeking challenges."

In a word: Mindset. Other runners ceased believing it would take a miracle to run a four-minute mile and began to believe they could break through the barrier. This rings true in the Jewish tradition. The Rabbis teach us not to rely on miracles. Achievement of challenging goals is not determined in the heavens; it comes through aspiration and perspiration.

I hope many of you will cheer on and encourage the runners on Marathon Sunday. It is always inspiring to watch them throughout the day. As you do, take a moment and reflect on the limits we set on ourselves, both physical and psychological, how we might shift our mindset, and recognize that the "four-minute mile" we seek is within our grasp.

Hanukkah Candle Lighting

Beginning at the far right, put the candles in the Hanukkiah from right to left, the direction of Hebrew writing. Light the candles from left to right, so each night you light the newest candle first. If possible, place the Hanukkiah in a window, so that it is visible from outside the house.

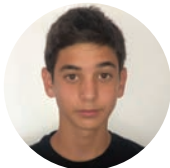

Creating a Home Base for the Next Generation

As I complete my first year at PAS, I've reflected on all that has been accomplished in our youth and teen department over the last twelve months. We owe our success to the enthusiasm and commitment of our kids and their families. Looking ahead, we have not only planned exciting and impactful programs, trips, and events, but we also have new approaches and spaces to engage our youth and teens in what looks to be an incredible year for an ever-growing department.

First, I'm thrilled to announce the formation of a Teen Executive Board. Five teen leaders will meet once a month to spearhead the development and expansion of our programming. These teens will run the Teen Leadership Council and help to implement motivational, fun programs.

In the revitalized 87th Street building, PAS teens have a place of their own to socialize, study, volunteer, play board games, and more. The fourth floor Teen Lounge will house community gatherings, social events,

and opportunities for teens to lead and be heard! We hope the lounge will become a home where the next generation of our community (and of the Jewish people) feel connected and empowered. The lounge represents the great presence of teens in our community and offers an open door for all who want to learn more about their Jewish identity. We invite everyone at PAS to visit the Teen Lounge, grab a snack, and learn more about youth and teen programming.

Our department is also expanding! In October, we welcomed Chloe Jacobs as our Youth Coordinator. Chloe will work with me, focusing on our youth activities (grades 3–8) and especially on the bridge to the post-bnei mitzvah experience.

Beyond the PAS campus, the world is our classroom. Building on the success of last year's teen trip to Madrid, we are offering different trips for three age groups this year: an overnight trip to Great Wolf Lodge in Pennsylvania for 8th graders; a long weekend in Houston for 9th and 10th graders; and

an extended weekend trip to Berlin, Germany for 11th and 12th graders.

All our achievements and all our plans are only possible with the participation of PAS teens and their families. The years following bnei mitzvah are a critical time to continue developing young people's Jewish engagement. Whether a child is into sports, theater, learning, movies, social action, or other activities, we have outlets for them to pursue their interests in a Jewish framework. As we look forward to the rededication of the 87th Street building, let's also take a step back to appreciate how powerful and lucky we are to host hundreds of programs for Jewish engagement and identity building and to share these experiences with a community of hundreds of likeminded Jews.
