The Changing Face of the Jewish Family

THE MATRIARCHS AND PATRIARCHS must have been home schooled. In the founding stories of our people there is no hint of any educational system outside of the home. Wisdom, ethics, literacy and everything else were taught parent to child, the responsibility of each household to cultivate the next generation. Even in the generations that followed, as institutions of learning arose, the paramount importance of the home as the primary shaper of character remained. The responsibility to teach values, professional skills, even how to swim, lay squarely on the single most important educational structure – the family.

This year, our annual Shabbaton will turn our focus to the changing face of the Jewish family. We are honored to welcome perhaps the three most important voices on the subject into our community. Best-selling author Dr. Wendy Mogel will address questions of the culture of our households and counsel us on how to engage in the delicate task of creating self-reliant children who reflect the ideals we as parents and grandparents seek to pass down. Rabbi Kerry Olitzky, who is at the forefront of the national conversation on Jewish outreach, will help us navigate the prickly conversation (that touches so many of our families) of how to encourage and reinforce Jewish identity, while recognizing that our families include non-Jews. Finally, Dr. Steven Cohen, the foremost sociologist of American Jewry,

will offer insights into the changing nature of the American Jewish family, and how the organized Jewish community should set its priorities based on a real-time view of who we are today. In the rhythm of our communal calendar, the weekend has become a terrific way to connect with old friends and meet new ones, all the while discussing the most pressing issues facing our families and the Jewish community. Periods of Transition



THERE IS A POPULAR CUSTOM

following a Jewish wedding known as *sheva b'rakhot*, seven blessings, after the blessings

said under the huppah. For a week – seven days – after the wedding, friends and family continue to shower the new couple with blessings and joy. A lesser-known tradition calls for extending the merriment through the first thirty days and for the full year following marriage.

Weddings are not the only lifecycle event followed by a 7-day, 30-day, and one-year ritual. Following the death of a loved one, a mourner “sits shiva” for a period of seven days, while family, friends and community provide comfort. The mourning period continues for a total of 30 days following the death of children, siblings, or a spouse, and for a

full year following the loss of a parent. Is it just a coincidence that both marriage and death are followed by these periods of time?

While marriage is a significant life-transition for the loving couple who marry, death is a life-transition for the loved ones who are left behind. Both marriage and death are not moments but rather processes. Marriage represents the process of beginning a loving relationship. Mourning, on the other hand, is all about how a loving relationship ends. The goal of Jewish marriage and mourning rituals is to aid, guide, and inform these processes.

As part of a new initiative to aid in the process of grieving, PAS will be offering a bereavement support group beginning in February. I will be co-leading the group, together with a social worker from JBFCS (Jewish Board of Family and Children’s Services). The group will provide a safe, structured, and

confidential environment in which to recognize and respect your own grieving process, understand the emotional, physical, and spiritual impact of loss, and find meaning and comfort in sharing with others. We will draw on Jewish tradition, including stories, songs, poetry and prayer, for guidance, comfort and strength.

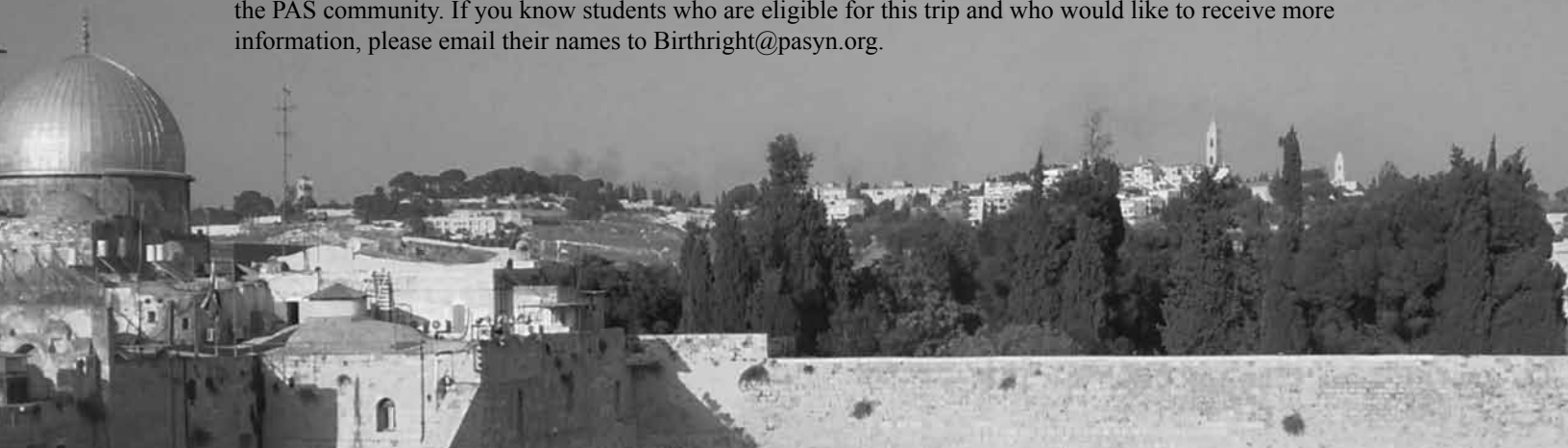
The sages of the Talmud taught, “If a person’s heart is heavy with worry, let him unburden himself to other people” (BT Yoma 75a). Together with the others in the Bereavement Support Group, we will share the process of bringing closure to a loving relationship.

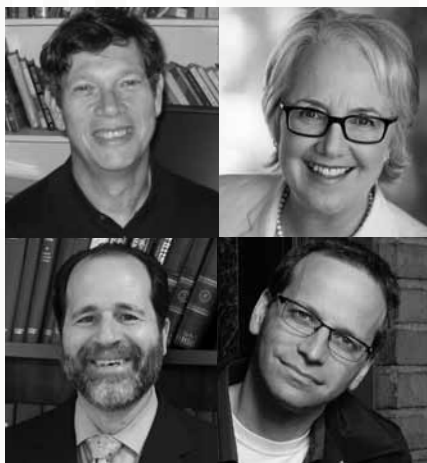
