Home & Synagogue: Intersection of Jewish Literacy

s a parent of two young children, I see that my children copy everything I do. Little phrases I say, I hear repeated back. They like to eat snacks instead of meals. They love eating challah and singing *Dayenu*.

The home is the first source of Jewish learning; parents are their children's primary Jewish educators. But we can't do everything for our kids. We hire caregivers to be with them when we are at work, have groceries delivered to provide nourishment, and send them to school for formal education to build on what we teach them at home, *ba-bayit*.

The word *bayit*, Hebrew for house or home, is the basis for naming many significant places in Jewish life. *Beit Knesset* is a house of gathering, thus a synagogue. *Beit Midrash* is house of study. And *Beit HaSefer*, the "house of the book," is a school. Learning within a community is a core Jewish value – coming together to learn and pray is a must.

Among American Jewry, the second major source of Jewish

education is Congregational School, a Jewish educational system which supplements what children learn in "regular" school and what they learn at home. At the PASCS, we take this responsibility seriously, providing a robust curriculum that includes Judaics, Hebrew and tefillah. Teaching takes place in a classroom setting, where children learn with peers, make friends, and benefit from all the resources of the synagogue, like tefillah led by our Principal Music Educator and cantors. At the same time, we know that everything that happens within the walls of our Lifelong Learning Center needs to be reinforced at home in order to take root and have a lasting impact.

The 20th-century education pioneer Joseph Schwab, most famous for his work on curriculum development, writes about four "commonplaces" that are present in every educational enterprise: subject matter, learners, teachers, and milieu. The nexus of success is where all four commonplaces intersect. In our context, each learner's milieu is both the individual family and the community-at-large. Our children succeed in their Jewish education when learning at home is reinforced by learning in the classroom, and vice versa.

The Congregational School is here to support and reinforce your efforts to make your home your child's first place of Jewish learning. Hang a *mezuzah*, celebrate Shabbat and holidays, discuss the weekly Torah portion over a traditional Shabbat dinner or over a pizza, host family and friends for a meal. (*Hakhnasat orhim*/hospitality is a Jewish value whether it's for Shabbat or the Super Bowl.) Use your imagination to make your home part of the nexus of success for your children's Jewish education and identity.

The fast of *Sh'va asar b'Tammuz* begins the period known as "the three weeks," a period of mourning culminating in Tisha b'Av, the 9th of Av. According to tradition, on the 17th of Tammuz in 586 BCE, the walls of the First Temple were breached by the Babylonians, and on the same date in 69 CE, the walls of the Second Temple were breached by the Romans. Like the three other minor fasts of the year, the fast of the 17th of Tammuz is from dawn until dark, not from sunset to sunset. When the 17th of Tammuz falls on Shabbat, like this year, the fast is observed on the 18th.

e look forward to the High Holidays, beginning with Erev Rosh Hashanah on Sunday, September 29. We are thrilled that we will be back in our 87th Street building, both in the Sanctuary and in the revitalized Lower Level. We will also conduct services again at our Fifth Avenue location, as well as family services, teen services, young family services, and services and programming for children in grades K−7. Locations for all these services will be announced in September, and we anticipate warm and meaningful High Holiday Services in all locations.

High Holiday tickets will be mailed in September to members in good standing. If you have not yet made arrangements to pay your synagogue dues, we encourage you to do that now. No tickets will be required for Erev Rosh Hashanah and Yizkor services. To ensure that every PAS member has seats for the High Holidays, we ask that you purchase guest tickets only for your immediate family members, including children above the age of 23. Each household will be limited to two guest tickets. All guest tickets are for admission at the Fifth Avenue service only.

Caring Network



fter more than 16 months in our temporary location at 4 East 90th Street, we are on schedule to move staff offices and programs back to 87th Street this fall for the start of the Early Childhood Center year, High Holidays, and fall programming! Although we expect that our move from PAS@90th to PAS@87th will take place in late summer, the transition will continue well into 5780, as we acclimate to the beautiful spaces at PAS@87th, assign new locations to minvan and other programs, and establish relationships with new caterers. Throughout all the changes over the period of transition, it has been abundantly clear that the space is secondary to the wonderful and committed PAS community members who have demonstrated grace and flexibility over the last year and a half. While our contractors are now putting final touches on PAS@87th, we want to share photos from an earlier stage of the construction this past May. Over a year earlier, on May 3, 2018, the annual PAS Gala was the final event held in the Lower Level of 87th Street before construction. At the Gala, members of the community signed poster boards with congratulations for the past and wishes for the future.
