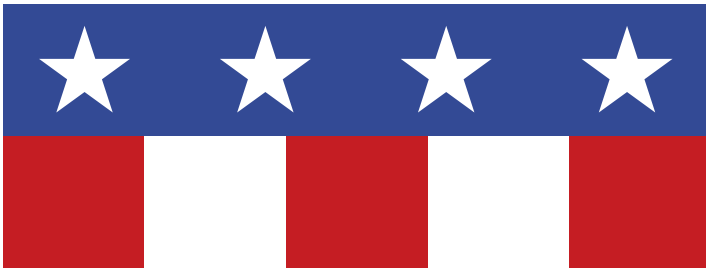


Getting Out the Vote this Fall!

Resources for Voting

Making each of our voices heard through voting in local, state, and national elections is an important mitzvah that each of us who are eligible can undertake this fall. Whether voting in person or by mail, early or on Election Day, we want to help everyone in our community fulfill this mitzvah.

Below you will find resources about voting in New York City and ways you can help others get the information they need to vote, whether here in New York State or elsewhere.



Tuesday, November 5, 2024:

General Election

This election includes races for President of the United States, US Senators for New York, and may include NY State government races and ballot measures depending on your district.

Register to Vote

- ★ Application must be received either by mail or in person by October 26, 2024.
- ★ To complete a voter registration application, visit <https://vote.nyc/page/register-vote>, where you can complete the application online or download a paper application to submit by mail.

Vote by Mail

- ★ Any registered voter may apply for an early mail ballot.
- ★ Each person must apply for themselves.
- ★ Voters are not permitted to cast a ballot on a voting machine if they have been issued an early mail or absentee ballot for that election unless they request an affidavit ballot.
- ★ The last day to apply online is October 26, 2024.

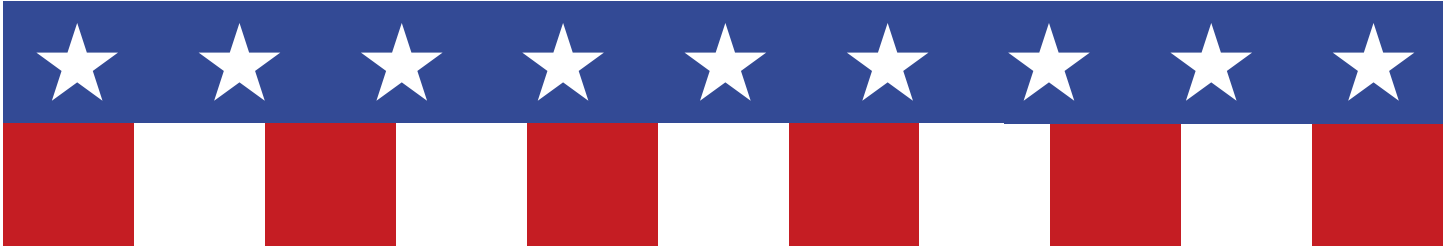
Early Voting

- ★ The early voting period in New York City is from October 26–November 2, 2024.

- ★ On Election Day, poll sites are open from 6:00 am–9:00 pm.
